Students' Preference in learning Grammar: Teacher-Centered VS Student-Centered

It is proved that very little can be conveyed without proper Grammar in a language; therefore many language teachers pay their attention to make their students perfect in Grammar. English language teachers also focus mainly on teaching English Grammar in ESL classrooms. A questionnaire will be distributed to those students to explore their preferences in learning Grammar. This research will facilitate ESL lectures at the ELTU as the findings will be an assist to conduct ESL lectures in an effective and beneficial way for students.
